Ignore offers of transportation from solicitors in the terminal. Soliciting of ground transportation in the airport is illegal and many illegal solicitors are unlicensed and uninsured. Participants should head directly for the taxi stand located outside each terminal for safe and legitimate transportation. Ignore non-uniformed people offering to assist with baggage. Seek out uniformed porters or airline employees for baggage assistance.

Once settled into their housing, participants should call Samantha at 718-333-2202 to make arrangements for their orientation and training. If they get the answering machine there will be instructions on when the next orientation is being held.

Additional Comments:

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Participants must bring originals and copies of their visa, passport, DS-2019 and job offer. Participants must honor their contract and show up to work on their scheduled shifts. If they do not show up for a scheduled shift and do not call in advance to say they cannot make it, their employment will be terminated.

The ideal participant has the ability to work hard in a not ideal environment. The busiest time is when it is sunny and hot. The work areas do not have air conditioning. Participants are also on their feet the entire time. Participants must have the ability to stay positive while working hard and serving customers.

For those positions that are union, they will be required to pay the union fees through their paycheck deduction, but will receive the following benefits:

- The union to represent participants for any grievances
- Participants will NOT need to pay the \$75 union initiation fee
- · Note that all seasonal employees, including Americans, are required to pay these dues

On special event days, such as holidays, concerts, parades, etc., participants will be scheduled to work between 9 and 11 hours. On any shift when employees work more than 9.5 hours, they will receive an additional \$13.50 for the shift (one payment). In any week when participants work more than 40 hours, they will receive time and a half per hour for those hours over 40.

The work week is from Monday to Sunday and the schedule will be posted on Thursday. Time-off requests must be in writing and handed in no later than the Wednesday prior to the schedule posting day (Thursday). Time off will be given if there are enough employees to work the participant's normal shift. Once the schedule is posted, no changes will be made.

When it rains, very few people are needed to work. Rather than showing up to work and be sent home, participants should call the restaurant to see if they are required to work on that day. Also, if it starts raining during their shift, participants may be sent home early. They can make up the lost hours by working an extra day on their normal day off or by working a longer shift on sunny and warm days. They can also make up the hours by doing other jobs in the restaurant such as cooking, cleaning and kitchen work. Participants will still work over 32 hours per week on average through the duration of their programs, as participants will frequently work more than 32 hours during the busy weeks.

Participants whose employment is terminated (involuntary or voluntarily), will have 2 weeks from the time that they end their position to secure permanent housing that complies with Greenheart Exchange's Housing Guidelines and submit a Self-Arranged Job Offer (SAJO) to Greenheart Exchange for consideration. Participant's failure to submit a SAJO within a two-week timeframe will result in shortening the participant's program sponsorship. If Greenheart Exchange rejects SAJO, the participant has 1 business day to resubmit SAJO in accordance with instructions received from Greenheart Exchange.
