Job Description:

Dishwashers are responsible for unloading the dishes and cutlery brought to them by bussers and loading them into dish trays. The trays are then placed into the commercial washers and blasted with scalding hot water. The commercial dishwashing machines can't always accommodate larger pots and pans, so occasionally you may be required to wash things by hand, the old fashioned way. Dishwashers are almost always the last person to leave at night so be prepared for some late nights (especially on the weekends). Even after the last table's been served, the kitchen needs to be cleaned and the trash has to be emptied. There is a large element of cleaning the kitchen and restaurant equipment. You will remove trash and garbage and place in trash compactor, clean and hose out garbage cans. You will also help keep the entire kitchen clean, which is a team effort. You will sweep and mop the kitchen floors. You will wash dishes, trays, pots and pans used in cooking and serving. You will help dining room staff by scraping food from plates and stacking them in the dishwasher. You will also need to clean coolers, kitchen tables, refrigerators and prep-stations.

Upper body strength is VERY important. There is a lot of heavy lifting and moving involved.

You need to be able to speak, write and read comfortably in English.

Excellent communication and hospitality skills (English IS required)!

You need to be able to lift/pull/carry up to 40 pounds and push up to 100 pounds.

You need to be able to comfortably and clearly take orders in the English language.

You must be able to work quickly, in a group and independently, and stand for long periods of time.

Listening: Dish Washers need to be able to hear and understand specific instructions from the kitchen.

Stamina: Everyone in the kitchen works long hours on their feet over hot stoves and grills. Stamina is needed.

You will need to connect with Dan Courtney [the landlord] after you are hired to save a slot in his housing complex. His contact information is above. Housing is provided for the whole summer season. Housing is collected on the 1st and 15th of the month. Students will have their own beds, bathrooms, wifi, microwave, community kitchen, a/c, washer and dryer. There are 3 beds in every room, you will share the space with 2 more students. Given the nature of the space, we cannot accommodate couples. There is a \$200 security deposit that is refunded at the end of the summer when the room is cleaned and if student stays the entire summer. Leaving earlier than the last date agreed upon will mean you will lose your security deposit. Students are welcome to secure alternate housing.
