PLACEMENT INFORMATION

Job Description:

Food Service workers set up and clean up kitchen and table areas, sell/or prepare various food items for customers.

Food Service employees are required to perform various food and beverage related tasks including:

- Cooking or preparing food items according to procedures or recipes.
- Placing food items on serving plates or dishes along with required condiments and utensils to present to customers.
- Preparing cold drinks, warm drinks and other non-alcoholic beverages.
- All items must be prepared quickly and accurately ensuring no waste and in accordance with production and portion requirements and quality standards while maintaining a safe, sanitary work environment.
- Food Service employees may be responsible for handling sales which will include: taking correct orders, entering sales in a cash register, taking money, counting out correct change (coins/bills), giving change (coins/bills) to customers, and completing credit card transactions.

-All Food Service employees will be responsible for maintaining and cleaning all Food Service areas including preparation tables, equipment, dishes, floors, supply areas, refrigerators, coolers, sales areas, and customer areas (tables, chairs, serving lines, condiment stands, etc)

-Demonstrate a high level of customer service. Respond to and take appropriate action to resolve concerns and complaints of guests.

-Keep supervisor/ manager informed of situations relating to facility operation, patron complaints or concerns, accidents, emergency situations, damages and potential safety hazards.

-Attend departmental and team meetings as well as participate in all training courses.

-Perform all duties in a safe manner.

-Employees may be asked to move to different locations or job assignments within the property, as needed. Other duties may be assigned.

Typical Schedule:

Holidays, weekends and nights shifts are required. There is 7-10 day notice for all requested days off, if multiple people want the same day off it is not always possible.

All work is weekend only until Memorial weekend and after Labor Day, during the season we are open full time and a minimum of 35 hours must be worked. Weekend, night and holiday shifts are required.

Employer can provide housing for 2/3rds of the students but will find additional housing for remaining students that is similar in price and type. Company housing varies. We have houses, apartments, and rooms. Students can find their own housing, but must notify employer if they choose to do that. The housing cost is likely to be \$90 or higher, adjusted for shoulder seasons to accommodate fewer working hours.

Casino Pier has a very strict no cell phone policy while working. All cellphones must be stored away properly prior to the start of their shift. Shifts are assigned by the scheduling manager and will be posted two weeks in advance online for employees to view. It is the responsibility of the employee to check their schedule and be on time for their shift. Any additional time off needed will need a request submitted with at least two weeks notice, time off requests are not guaranteed approvals. All employees are required to work a night shift, a weekend shift and all holiday shifts.

Seaside Heights has a noise ordinance that is strictly enforced during the summer, no large parties are allowed in housing, if there are any tickets/fines that are given, it is the responsibility of the tenant to pay.
