We have had dozens of J-1 students in the past and they have all greatly enjoyed working and living here.

Participants will be meeting new people and interacting with Americans and other international participants at work and during their time off. This area receives many tourists so participants will be able to interact with local Americans and visitors from around the world on a daily basis. Experiencing American culture will be part of participants' lives while living in this seasonal area.

Participants whose employment is terminated (involuntarily or voluntarily) have 2 weeks from the last day of work to find a new job and to submit a valid and complete Self-Arranged Job Offer (SAJO) to Greenheart Exchange for consideration. If the participant fails to submit a SAJO within the 2 week deadline, Greenheart Exchange will shorten the participant's program.

Greenheart Exchange rejects the SAJO, the participant has one (1) business day to resubmit a new or a revised SAJO, based on the directions received from Greenheart Exchange.
