As a restaurant host or hostess, participants will be greeting guests arriving at the restaurant, welcoming and seating them.

The responsibilities of the host include monitoring the open dining sections of the restaurant for empty and cleaned tables, estimating wait times for guests, monitoring the guest waiting list, and ensuring that the needs of the guests are met while they are waiting. The host is often responsible for answering the telephone, booking reservations and moving tables together to accommodate large parties.

Participants may be using cleaning chemicals. Participants will be handling pork products.

Historically, Hosts on average make up to \$50-\$100 in tips on average per shift. These tips are distributed at least every week. The host/hostess will receive 3% of the servers' tips. HOWEVER, it is up to the guests' discretion and how busy the restaurant is. Tips will be distributed at least every week. Managers will provide guidelines to staff.

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# Brief description of housing:

The employer will make housing assignments prior to participants' arrival. The employer has reserved these housing options for participants with local landlords. Participants' housing agreements will be with their landlords, not the employer.

The housing options typically consist of 2-to-4-bedroom houses or apartment/condo units. All housing options, participants will have their own beds, either individual single beds or bunk beds. Participants will be sharing bedrooms, typically with 2 to 4 participants per room. Participants will be sharing bathrooms, larger apartments may have 2.

Participants will also be sharing bathrooms, but in general no more than 4 participants will be sharing one bathroom.

The housing options have kitchens, and participants will be provided with kitchenware.

It is typical for participants' landlords to conduct housing inspections throughout the season, to ensure that participants are keeping their housing clean and well maintained. Landlords are required to give advance notice to participants prior to entering their housing.

If a participant is fired or quits their job during the season, they are still allowed to stay in their housing, but they would have to continue to pay their landlord rent for the remainder of their program.

Students will only receive their deposit back if they stay the entire 12 weeks. if they move out early, they forfeit deposit.

\*Another requirement for participants to receive their deposit back is that they leave their housing clean, undamaged, and in good condition upon departure.

Participants whose employment is terminated (involuntarily or voluntarily) have 2 weeks from the last day of work to find a new job and to submit a valid and complete Self-Arranged Job Offer (SAJO) to Greenheart Exchange for consideration. If the participant fails to submit a SAJO within the two-week deadline, Greenheart Exchange will shorten the participant's program.

If Greenheart Exchange rejects the SAJO, the participant has one (1) business day to resubmit a new or a revised SAJO, based on the directions received from Greenheart Exchange. Information about prohibited jobs for SWT program participants can be found at https://greenheartexchange.org/host/host-hire-seasonal-staff/#/tab/regulations.

If the participant no longer has housing, the participant must look for permanent housing immediately, and within two weeks must secure permanent housing that complies with Greenheart Exchange's Housing Guidelines. The new housing address must be submitted to Greenheart Exchange within 24 hours of any change of address.
