PLACEMENT INFORMATION

Job Description:

Specific positions are assigned upon arrival to Six Flags. Entry–level positions include: Ride Operator or Food Service Team Member. All employees will be responsible for the following:

- *Demonstrate a high level of customer service. Respond to and take appropriate action to resolve concerns and complaints of guests.
- •Keep supervisor/manager informed of situations relating to facility operation, patron complaints or concerns, accidents, emergency situations, damages, and potential safety hazards.
- Attend departmental and team meetings as well as participate in all additional training courses.
- •Perform all duties in a safe manner.
- •Employees may be asked to move to different locations or job assignments within the property, as needed.
- Other duties may be assigned.

Ride Operator:

- Constantly monitor and regulate the behavior of patrons and co-workers in the ride area to prevent unsafe activities and accidents.
- Warn patrons of safety hazards and enforce rules and regulations in a positive and courteous manner.
- Assist guests in and out of rides which may include lifting children into seats and buckling seat-belts and/or safety harnesses.
- Operate ride controls, buttons, and switches which may be mechanical, computerized, or a combination of both.
- Prepare ride area for opening and closing each day which may include test runs of the ride.
- •Keep all ride areas clean including: seats, cars/trains, ride platform, and guest line area. This may include sweeping, scrubbing, mopping, dusting, polishing, vacuuming, and picking up trash.
- Control entry to ride areas by monitoring pass/ticket usage.

Food Host/Hostess:

- Cooking or preparing food items according to procedure or recipes.
- Preparing cold drinks, warm drinks, and any other non-alcoholic beverages.
- •All items must be prepared quickly and accurately ensuring no waste and in accordance with production and portion requirements and quality standards while maintaining a safe, sanitary work environment.
- Handling sales which will include: taking correct orders, entering sales in a cash register taking money, counting out correct change (coins/bills), giving change (coins/bills) to customers, and completing credit card transactions.
- Maintaining and cleaning all Food Service areas including preparation tables, equipment, dishes, floors supply areas, refrigerators, coolers, sales areas, and customer areas (tables, chairs, serving lines, condiment stands, etc.).

Test equipment daily before opening the ride to guests. Restrict the number of guests on the loading platform to the number who can be seated on the ride. For reasons of safety, ability to speak and understand English must be excellent. Ensure safe operation of rides. Assist with the loading and unloading of ride to include small children and guests with disabilities. Verify that safety restraints and belts are correctly secured before the ride is set into motion. Take appropriate action to answer or resolve guest questions and complaints. Record ride capacity and cycles. Give directions and deliver ride spiel using a microphone. Enforce ride restrictions and recommendations. Students are expected to work the dates and position to which they agree during the hiring event.

Uniform Policy:

Our Wardrobe team will provide two uniform shirts for all positions and two pairs of shorts for most positions at no cost. Associates will be required to provide their own pants and shoes for all work locations. (Out of pocket expense of roughly \$75). Uniforms vary on work location and more information will be provided during wardrobe fitting. Most positions require a closed toe athletic shoe that is mostly white, gray, or black with no bright neon colors.

Description:

Hair, including facial hair, must be neat, clean and well-groomed each day. For safety purposes, long hair is to be pulled back. One gauge no larger than ½ inch or 12mm in each ear may be in place of earrings. Tattoos/body art are permitted as long as the tattoos/body art do not display slogans or images that are demeaning, feature profanity or other messages that do not promote or enhance a safe, inclusive, productive workplace. Visible tattoos/body art on the face or neck are not permitted.

Students will be provided housing and will be staying in mobile homes that are immobilized. Each mobile home has a living space, a small kitchen, 2 bedrooms and one bathroom. Students have their own section within Darien Lake's camp ground. Students will have a bathroom, their own bedroom and bed. The trailers provide the students with the adventure of living close to nature. Wifi is provided free of charge. Units will be assigned to a maximum of two students per unit (1 per bedroom).
